

NAME

dirname - strip last component from file name

SYNOPSIS

dirname [*OPTION*] *NAME*...

DESCRIPTION

Output each *NAME* with its last non-slash component and trailing slashes removed; if *NAME* contains no */*'s, output *'.'* (meaning the current directory).

-z, --zero

end each output line with NUL, not newline

--help display this help and exit

--version

output version information and exit

EXAMPLES

```
dirname /usr/bin/
```

```
-> /usr
```

```
dirname dir1/str dir2/str
```

```
-> dir1 followed by dir2
```

```
dirname stdio.h
```

```
-> .
```
