# **DESCRIPTION**

The /etc/group file is a text file that defines the groups on the system. There is one entry per line, with the following format:

```
group name:password:GID:user list
```

The fields are as follows:

 $group\_name$  the name of the group.

password the (encrypted) group password. If this field is empty, no password is needed.

GID the numeric group ID.

user list a list of the usernames that are members of this group, separated by commas.
